HELLO FROM THE MANSE

Dear Friends

Spring is coming! I love this time of the year when we begin to see new growth. It is so heartwarming when snowdrops make an appearance, then of course more colour with daffodils, tulips and other spring flowers. They bring with them a sense of hope that, in the darkness of the winter season, we know that it will give way to spring and bring warmth and light.

As we approach Spring, the Church turns its thoughts to the season of Lent. This is a time for Christians to pause and consider what truly matters. Rooted in the Christian tradition, it recalls the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness that we read about in Matthew 4:1-2, which was a time of challenge and preparation. Yet, beyond its religious significance, Lent carries a message that speaks to all of us – the rhythm of letting go and beginning anew.



This season falls at a turning point in the year. The darkness of winter slowly gives way to spring, and signs of new life emerge. Buds push through frozen ground, trees begin to bud and blossom, and the warmth of longer days reminds us that change is always possible. What once seemed bare and colourless is quietly preparing for renewal.

Lent invites us into that same pattern. It is a time to step back, to let go of what no longer nourishes us, and to make space for something new. Just as nature sheds the weight of winter, we too can release burdens – whether it be old habits, distractions, or things that pull us away from who we truly want to be.

But Lent is not only about letting go; it is also about looking forward. It is about hope. The challenges of winter do not last forever, and neither do the difficult seasons in our lives. We are reminded with the coming of spring that growth happens even when we cannot see it.

At its heart the season of Lent is a journey of love. It reminds Christians that God's love is costly, that Jesus willingly walked the road to Calvary to sacrifice himself for the sins of the world. But it also reminds us of the hope beyond the cross – the empty tomb, the victory of life over death, and the promise of resurrection.

As we journey through this Lenten season to that glorious Easter celebration, may we take time to notice the small signs of new life and be reminded that change, healing, and hope are always possible, and that God's love is always with us.

What could you give up for Lent?

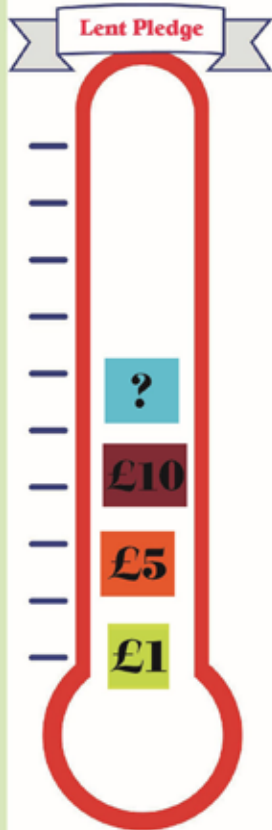
Maybe chocolates or crisps, maybe cakes & puddings etc?

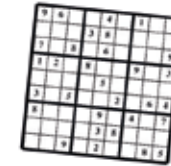

We would just like to take this opportunity to introduce ourselves as the new Headteacher and Depute Headteacher at Newtown Primary School and Nursery. After a period of temporary senior leadership within the school, we officially joined the team following the Christmas break.

We have been blown away by how welcoming all children, staff and parents have made us feel over the past few weeks. Whenever there are changes, this can naturally result in some anxiety over what the future will hold. ST BOSWELLS PRIMARY SCHOOL

2025 sees the beginning of, not only a new term for the school but also a new era, as it is the first time since 2009 that St Boswells has not been in partnership with Newtown Primary School. Although there will continue to be shared events for pupils and staff going on between the two schools, a restructure of the Earlston cluster means that St Boswells now stands alone with its own leadership team consisting of Miss Caroline Hardie as Acting Headteacher and Mrs Jill Calvert as Principal Teacher.



With just four weeks into the new term, it has been feeling very busy with lots of exciting learning activities going on throughout the school. The whole school focus has been on Scots Language and celebrating the life of Robert Burns. We are very proud of our P7 pupils who worked hard to prepare and host a delightful Burns Lunch on Thursday 23rd of January. It is the first time in the history of St Boswells that we have had one of our own pupils pipe in the haggis. Huge well done to Magnus Barker (P7).

The annual Scots poetry competition took place last week with the grand final taking place during our Scots Celebration Afternoon. All our pupils have worked so hard to prepare for this and performed with clarity, confidence and enthusiasm. The afternoon consisted of 15 finalists reciting their poems as well as each class performing different well known Scottish Songs. Of course, it couldn't end without a whole school rendition of Auld Lang Syne. The results of the competition will be announced soon.

As we continue to try and foster links with the community one of our favourite ways to do this is to attend Wednesday Warmups in the Village Hall. Our pupils love to share their learning with some of our older residents in the village and it is wonderful to see the interaction that goes on between the generations. This term we have already had visits from P6 & P5 and there is still a visit from P7 due to take place on Wednesday 5th March.

Thank you to Rev Sheila who continues to show great support and loyalty to our school, attending weekly assemblies as well as special events in the school. The support of the church and the whole community is what helps to make our school so special and unique.

PRAYER

**For GOD so loved the world, that HE gave HIS only SON,
that whosoever believes in HIM, should not perish,
but have eternal life.**

(John 3 v 16)

The sun had gone down in Jerusalem. JESUS was alone, when HE heard the footfall of a visitor. It was Nicodemus, one of the rulers in Israel. His opening words were 'We know that YOU are a Teacher sent from GOD.' (John 3 v 2) The 'we' would have been friends of Nicodemus: Pharisees, like himself, who admired JESUS. He, and they, wanted to know more. JESUS turned the conversation around, from 'we' Into the personal, and on to spiritual matters.

Nicodemus was confused. For JESUS had said to him: 'You must be born again.' As a Pharisee, and as a member of the Sanhedrin, Nicodemus would have studied the Scriptures (Old Testament) extensively; yet he did not grasp the concept, nor the significance of spiritual birth. A second time JESUS said to him: 'You need to be born again of the SPIRIT in order to understand spiritual matters.' Three times in that recorded conversation JESUS told Nicodemus emphatically: 'You need to be born again of the SPIRIT.'

The forgiveness of GOD for our sins is for all humankind. It is enabled by HIS SON, who came to save us from the consequences of sin and bring us to new life. JESUS' completed work on earth accomplished this. Forgiveness brings a new beginning. It enables spiritual birth. Anyone who comes to CHRIST for pardon comes into a relationship with CHRIST. Prayer changes things. The most important prayer in any life is that which brings us back to the FATHER through HIS beloved SON.

I know a man, who, one evening in the 1950s, knelt by his bed and asked forgiveness from CHRIST in response to a Gospel message on the radio. He still walks with CHRIST today. I know a woman, who, in her early teens, came to CHRIST with hundreds of others, in response to Billy Graham's Gospel message. She still walks with CHRIST today. I know a woman, who, at the age of 19, was sitting in a crowded church hall, when a young Faith Mission Pilgrim said 'If anyone here wants to have CHRIST in their life will you stand up during this next hymn.' Two people stood up. That woman still walks with CHRIST today.

The love of GOD in HIS SON has brought millions of people forgiveness and new life down through the centuries. It will continue to do so until HE returns. The work of those who love and follow CHRIST is to love and pray for others.

May GOD richly bless you as you follow CHRIST in HIS love.
